

From the Secondary Principal's Desk

For the secondary principal, May really is the most wonderful time of the school year. While extremely busy and full of events during school and into the evenings and weekends, it is a time of culmination. In Acts 20: 22-27, Paul is saying goodbye to the Ephesian leaders. In his final farewell, he says, "I have spent time with you preaching about the kingdom. I know that none of you will ever see me again. So I tell you today that I am not guilty if anyone has not believed. I haven't let anyone keep me from telling you everything God wants you to do." In this goodbye, Paul explains that he has finished this particular race - this chapter of his life will change to something new and different and he utilized every opportunity to present the Gospel and peace of Christ. During this season of the school year, many community members are finishing the race and turning the page to a new chapter of their lifestory. At the same time, this is a season of celebrating all that has been accomplished this memorable school year.

When I think about this year, one of the key highlights for me was the transition of the secondary assessment system to one that emphasizes assessment and reporting of key learning goals and indicators coinciding with the separation in reporting of non-academics behaviors or "soft-skills" through the use of the discipline card. One of our graduating seniors during exit interviews said that the new grading system in secondary sponsored a love for learning rather than grading. He used homework as a tool to learn rather than just another way to get a grade. Because he learned the content and skills through the year, studying for finals was less stressful. The opportunity to retake summative assessments, although he only did a few, provide a better balance and gave him the opportunity to grow, learn, and improve.

The student accomplishments this year have been remarkable and I am proud to partner with such gifted families. For the first time since the 15-16 school year, BAIS brought home an IISSAC championship banner (boys cross country)! Jeremy Budijono in 5th grade received various international mathematics awards. One of our graduates received an all-expenses paid, full-ride scholarship to his top-choice university. Battle of the Books won the championship. Raphael Kurniawan arrived home from the IISSAC swim competition with seven gold medals! Darrel Primandaru won first place in the KBP Spelling Bee hosted by BAIS. Our students also gave generously during chapel offerings raising more than 23 juta this


